Face Mask/Covering

Per California Department of Public Health (CDPH), students in all grade levels (PreK-Adult) are required to wear face coverings at all times while at school, **unless exempt:**

- Children under 2 years of age
- Students with a medical condition that would obstruct breathing (e.g. presents risk of serious adverse effect due to underlying conditions such as an acute exacerbation of COPD or Asthma) or are unconscious
- Students with a mental health condition or disability that prevents wearing a face covering (e.g., students who are incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance)
- Students who are **hearing impaired** (clear mask will be provided)

When deciding if children with certain disabilities should wear a mask, determine if they can:

- Use a mask correctly
- Avoid frequent touching of the mask and their face
- Limit sucking, drooling, or having excess saliva on the mask
- Remove the mask without assistance

If you believe your child will not be able to tolerate a face covering/mask, please contact your school nurse to discuss available accommodations at least one week before in-person instruction resumes

TIER 1) WIDESPREAD OR PURPLE

WHAT IT MEANS: Many nonessential indoor business operations are closed

CRITERIA

of new daily cases: More than 7 per 100K people Positivity rate: More than 8%

TIER 2) SUBSTANTIAL OR RED

WHAT IT MEANS: Some nonessential indoor business operations are closed

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: 4-7 per 100K people Positivity rate: Between 5% and 8%

TIER 3) MODERATE OR ORANGE

WHAT IT MEANS: Some indoor business operations are open with modifications

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: 1-3.9 per 100K people Positivity rate: Between 2% and 4.9%

TIER 4) MINIMAL OR YELLOW

WHAT IT MEANS: Most indoor business operations are open with modifications

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: Less than 1 per 100K people Positivity rate: Less than 2%



Asymptomatic Testing (TK- Adult)

- LBUSD will require everyone coming onto campus to be tested for coronavirus with a PCR test
- This test is a mid-nasal swab, so it is tolerated by our youngest students and students who are highly sensitive to touch
- If you have any questions regarding the mid-nasal swab PCR test, please contact the school nurse to discuss how to proceed.

Exemptions:

Students can be exempted from a specific week of testing, if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Currently experiencing symptoms of COVID-19
- Currently in quarantine as a close contact of someone with COVID-19
- Have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days
- Not feeling well for a reason other than suspected COVID-19, such as recovering from surgery, flu, strep throat, etc.



School Bus Transportation

- Parents/guardians will be required to complete the district's health screening questions prior to their child boarding the bus. Temperature checks will be conducted at the school site.
- Students will be required to wear a mask on the school bus, unless they qualify for an exemption
- Social distancing (at least 6 feet) including at entry doors will be maintained.
- Only one student per bench, unless they are siblings
- Natural ventilation (i.e., opening windows) will be used to increase outdoor air dilution of indoor air, when environmental conditions allow
- Ambulatory buses will accommodate up to 10 students per bus
- Wheelchair buses will accommodate two (2) persons (1 students and 1 aide, if needed)



- The DLP may need to be updated by IEP teams for students who selected a hybrid model to include any changes

Assessments


