Eligibility – Either the Student or one of the parents/grandparents must be on Native American Ancestry/Heritage/Descent. The student must be enrolled in a Long Beach Unified School District School and have a Title VI Student Eligibility Certificate filed with the American Indian Education, Title VI Program Office. Please note: Eligibility is NOT based upon any minimum blood quantum.

Schedule of Program Activities – California State Standards link Literacy and Visual Arts activities once a month at the Special Projects Training Center.

Tutoring – Students meet once a week, for two hours, with a Fully Credentialed Teacher. The tutor works in conjunction with the Student's Classroom Teacher to ensure academic growth.

Annual Student Recognition Day – Students and their respective Teachers are recognized for accomplishments that they have achieved during the academic year.

Community Partnerships – We partner with other Native American Organizations to enhance Healthy Lifestyles. Students and families are referred for several services depending upon their individual needs/wants.

Parent Committee – Parents and Guardians participate in monthly meetings at the Roosevelt Training Center or Teacher Resource Center once a month. Please call or visit our website to view the dates and times.
